It's so easy! It's so easy! The declaration is certainly worth repeating because this delightful quilt, aptly named "Worth Repeating," is so simple to make. In fact, it is a perfect quilt for beginners. Squares in a similar colorway are sewn together to make a strip; 16 strips are sewn together to make the quilt center; borders are added to all four sides. With careful attention to your fabric choices and the block placement, you can achieve a "gingham" look like that shown here. The quilt is a versatile decorating element. It can be laid over a bed or on a little side table to add a burst of unexpected color.

- ¼ yd. (0.23m) **each** lt.-blue and med.-blue print fabrics
- ¼ yd. (0.23m) **each** lt.-yellow and med.-yellow print fabrics
- ¼ yd. (0.23m) **each** lt.-purple and med.-purple print fabrics
- ¼ yd. (0.23m) **each** lt.-orange and med.-orange print fabrics
- 1 yd. (0.91m) lt.-pink print fabric
- ½ yd. (0.46m) med.-pink print fabric
- ¾ yd. (0.69m) lt.-green print fabric
- ⅜ yd. (0.34m) med.-green print fabric
- 3¼ yds. (2.97m) backing fabric, as desired
- 57" x 66" batting (1.45m x 1.68m)
- ⅜ yd. (0.34m) binding fabric, as desired
